Heather McDaniel Awarded Recertification in Economic Development Designation

Ithaca, NY, September 3, 2019 – Heather McDaniel, President of Tompkins County Area Development (TCAD) has been awarded re-certification by the International Economic Development Council (IEDC) effective (10/1/19).
